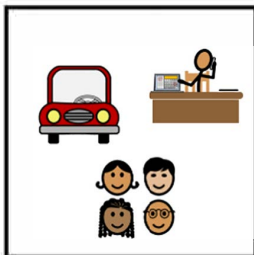

I will use the bathroom before starting my activity.

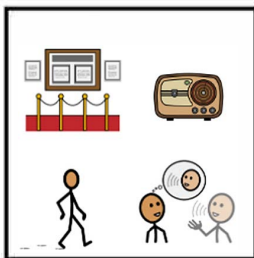

There will be other visitors exploring the museum too.

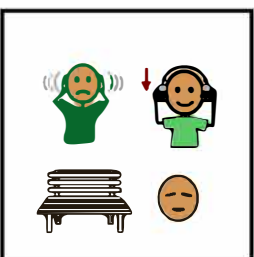

I will walk carefully and listen to any instruction from museum staff.

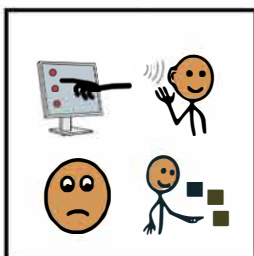

If I feel overwhelmed, I can step outside or find a quiet area.

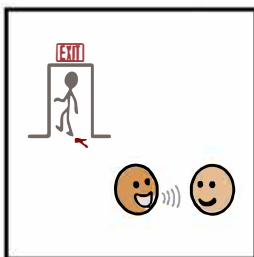

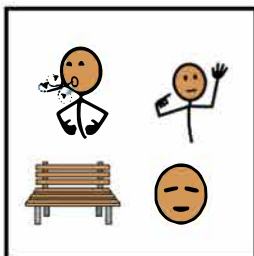
